

Landmark family violence report delivers proposals in Victoria

Two years ago, 11-year-old Luke Batty was murdered by his father at cricket practice. It was a tragedy which spurred his mother Rosie to campaign against domestic violence and push for reform. Today, after a 13-month inquiry, the findings of the Victorian Royal Commission into Family Violence will be made public. Victorian Premier Daniel Andrews has promised to accept every one of the report's 29 recommendations. They're expected to cover how courts, police, community services and politicians can better prevent family violence, improve early intervention, support victims and make perpetrators accountable.
